

Bidwell Park is near the intersection of three geologic regions: The Sierra Nevada Mountains to the east and south, the Cascade Range to the north, and the Sacramento /alley to the west. There's just as much geologic diversity underfoot, thanks to ancient olcanic activity. The deepest layer of rock, the gray sandstone of the Chico Formation, is ver 65 million years old and remains mostly hidden from view except for deep within Big hico Creek Canyon. Layered on top is the dark basalt of the Lovejoy Formation which pread over the area as quick-moving lava about 20 million years ago. Large boulders of asalt rock line and lie within Big Chico Creek from Bear Hole to Brown's Hole. The top and nost visible layer of rock is the 3 million-year-old Tuscan Formation, which forms the striking liffs of Upper Bidwell Park. Rocks in this formation are the result of mud flows (lahars) from xtinct volcanoes near current-day Lassen Peak.

Bidwell Park is "divided" by Manzanita Avenue. West of Manzanita Avenue is Lower Park. rom Manzanita Avenue to Horseshoe Lake is considered Middle Park. The area upstream and uphill of Horseshoe Lake is Upper Park. Middle Park includes many community parks, ecreation areas, and facilities steeped in history. Upper Park is a wonderful place to spend he day with its spectacular vistas, refreshing swimming holes, and miles of trails for hikers, nountain bikers, and equestrians of all skill levels.

Bidwell Park is home to a variety of important and sensitive natural resources in its diverse habitats, including native plant communities and wildlife. Several special-status species occur in its diverse habitats. The Park provides nesting and foraging habitat for many species raptors. Big Chico Creek provides spawning and rearing habitat for spring-run Chinook almon, and is home to five resident species of native, fish, many aquatic invertebrates, and mphibians. Big Chico Creek and its tributaries also serve as an important wildlife corridor, king the habitats of the foothills with those of the Sacramento River.




